This first citation comes directly from a library database – recall the tip about database citation tools!



## **Basic Guidelines for a Works Cited page:**

- 1. Title center Works Cited. Match the font with the rest of the document. No underlining or italics.
- 2. All entries are alphabetized by the first word in the entry whether it's a person's name or the title of a webpage. Ignore articles like *a, an, the* when alphabetizing.
- 3. Entire document is double-spaced.
- 4. All entries should be formatted in the hanging indent style. Ask me about this if you are unsure.
