Basic Guidelines for a Works Cited page:

1. Title – center Works Cited. Match the font with the rest of the document. No underlining or italics.
2. All entries are alphabetized by the first word in the entry – whether it's a person's name or the title of a webpage. Ignore articles like *a*, *an*, *the* when alphabetizing.
3. Entire document is double-spaced.
4. All entries should be formatted in the hanging indent style. Ask me about this if you are unsure.
